President's Message

As I review the past two years as CCN president, I am pleased with the progress made:

- CCN regained nonprofit corporation status with the IRS and was recertified by the SC Secretary of State's Office as a nonprofit charity.
- CCN invited many city department heads to speak at meetings to share information on water/sewer, streets/beautification, code enforcement, planning/development and trash/recycling.
- CCN earned an allocation from the city to help support neighborhood outreach, which we utilized to hire a communications/marketing specialist, better engage neighborhoods and launch a new website and several social media channels. We have reapplied for additional funding from the city for FY26.



- CCN also received a record amount in private donations including a sponsorship from Huntington Bank, which will be coming to the Columbia area at the end of the year.
- I am most proud of the work that CCN officers and committees accomplished by simplifying the process to join CCN with a fillable online form which led to an increased number of neighborhoods joining CCN.
- CCN also negotiated with the city to provide financial incentives to engaged neighborhoods.
- CCN decided to hold monthly meetings in different districts of Columbia and to make sure members engaged with City Councilpersons at membership meetings.
